About the Event

Westside Regional Center is organizing a series of training events on Evidence-Based Practices approved by the Los Angeles County Department of Mental Health for Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) services. Staff attending the training with the intention of claiming client services to Los Angeles County MHSA PEI Programs, must ensure that clients meet the PEI target population guidelines.

Seeking Safety (SS) is an evidence-based, counseling model to help people attain safety from trauma and/or substance abuse. The model was designed for flexible use. It can be conducted in group or individual format; for men and women; adults or adolescents; for any length of treatment; any level of care (e.g., outpatient, inpatient, residential); any type of trauma, any type of substance.

- Increase empathy and understanding of trauma and substance abuse.
- Provide assessment and treatment resources.
- Identify how to apply Seeking Safety for specific populations, such as homeless, adolescents, criminal justice, HIV, military/ veteran, individuals with developmental disabilities, etc.
