About the Event

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Westside Regional Center is providing a 3-hour workshop to community mental health providers to strengthen their knowledge of Regional Center eligibility and services, developmental differences profiles, and application of Child Parent Psychotherapy (CPP) with special needs populations.

This training will explore the application of CPP with intellectual and developmentally disabled populations. Participants will explore the core concepts of evidence-based practice in special needs infant-preschooler populations, evaluate mental health treatment issues specific to special needs populations and trauma, and discuss integration of the CPP model. - 3. Demonstrate understanding of developmental differences impact on trauma treatment.
- 4. Apply the CPP model with case study of intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- 5. Demonstrate understanding of how developmental differences and cognitive deficits impact the adaption of evidence-based practice, CPP.

She is recognized as an Infant/Preschool Mental Health Specialist and Reflective Practice Supervisor.
